Application

After completing the online application at our website, you should print out the form, have it signed by the relevant coordinator at the home university, and then send it by post to the International Office at LMU.

Application Deadlines

Winter Semester: June 1

Summer Semester: December 1

Registration

Registration of new incoming LMUexchange students takes place in September/October and March/April respectively. You will be informed about registration dates in the official letter of acceptance (Zulassungsbescheid), which you will receive after the application deadline.

Accommodation

Note: The months of March, August and September are officially free of lectures. However, students may have examinations, additional courses, or papers to concern themselves with during these months. Students should ask their academic supervisor about the examination schedule.

German Language Requirements at LMU

In order to make the most of your experience in Munich and at LMU, it is important to have good German language skills. Although many departments offer modules taught in English, the language of instruction at LMU is generally German, particularly at bachelor level.

At the time of application to LMU all exchange students are required to have at least level B1 (according to the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages"), unless stated otherwise at the link below. The same applies if you plan to take courses in English.

You should then take out German health insurance cover for the duration of your stay at LMU. Please note that travel insurance for the duration of your stay is not enough and will not be accepted at registration.
